LA CORUÑA, SPAIN

La Coruña is a city of many surprises, from its many medieval churches and palaces to its sensational restaurants and the famous Tower of Hercules.

PONTA DELGADA, AZORES

Ponta Delgada, on the island of Sao Miguel, sits in the middle of the Atlantic Ocean. It's home to stunning Portuguese architecture and flower-filled parks, while outside the city, dramatic rocky cliffs descend to pristine bays and gorgeous beaches.

ANTIGUA

Caribbean Antigua offers miles of wonderful sandy beaches and coves, in addition to dazzling birdlife and an incredible colonial atmosphere, ranging from the old stone windmills of long-abandoned sugar

plantations, to Nelson's Dockyard. As you approach the island, admire the white towers of St. John's Cathedral, dating back to 1845.

ST. KITTS

The fertile island of St. Kitts is a land of rainforests and tropical flowers. Take a stroll around the charming colonial streets and shops of the capital, Basseterre, tour the island, visit Brimstone Hill Fort, and perhaps visit St Kitts' sister isle, Nevis.

GADELOUPE

Enlivened by French and African influences, the Caribbean archipelago of Guadeloupe combines beautiful palm-fringed beaches with modern cities and lush rainforests. We will call at the gracious town of Pointe-à-Pitre, decorated in Gallic style, yet spiced with an exotic Creole flavour.

ST. LUCIA

Known as the 'Jewel of the Windward Islands'. St. Lucia's beauty is legendary, with the volcanic peaks of The Pitons soaring 2,000 feet up from the sea and magnificent rainforests boasting wild orchids, giant ferns and tropical wildlife. Unspoilt beaches, spectacular coral reefs, and markets offering fresh fruit and unique handicrafts add to the idyllic charm.

BEQUIA

Fringed by golden, sandy beaches, Bequia is the largest of the St. Vincent dependant Grenadine Islands. It's an island married to the sea, retaining age-old traditions of boat building, whaling and fishing. Admiralty Bay, the island's natural harbour, has been a favourite haven for ships and yachts for centuries.

ST. VINCENT

The green and fertile island of St. Vincent is part of the beautiful Grenadine archipelago, with a mountainous coastline dotted with beautiful black and white sandy beaches. Its clear waters are perfect for snorkelling and diving.

GRENADA

The rich aroma of cinnamon, nutmeg and cloves hovers over the fertile, volcanic hills of Grenada, renowned as the 'Spice Island' and famed for its sugar-white beaches. Its picturesque capital, St. George's, boasts the Caribbean's prettiest harbour, while terraces of pale, colour-washed houses and cheerful red roofs add to the charming blend of English and French colonial architecture.

BARBADOS

Miles of white sands, towering palms, sparkling turquoise waters and an idyllic atmosphere make Barbados the perfect place to enjoy your final day in the Caribbean. Sip exotic rum cocktails, enjoy some duty-free shopping, or soak up the sun.

FUNCHAL, MADEIRA

Known as the 'Floating Garden of the Atlantic' because of its glorious flora; including wild orchids, this sub-tropical island is also celebrated for its famous Madeira wine and stylish souvenirs.

VIGO, SPAIN

The attractive seaport of Vigo is situated on the shores of Vigo Bay, a spectacular Galician fjord extending 18 miles inland into picturesque country.
